

Key Updates:

- As per farmers and welfare department, as on 02nd Mar, summer Urad sowing down by 3.7% and Moong sowing up by 9% as compared with last year summer sowing.
- Total pulses import at Chennai port from 15 Feb to 21 Feb 2024 is 22,675 tonne. Out of which Burma Urad and Tur is 12375 tonne and 4850 tonne respectively.
- As per Gujarat agricultural department, summer pulses sowing in the state as on 4th March is down by 51.9% at 11, 438 ha. From 23787 ha at same time during previous year.
- THE AUSTRALIAN mungbean industry could set a record for production this harvest, with strong yields expected from an estimated 80,000-100,000 hectares planted. (link)
- The Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare released the 2nd Advance Estimates of Production of Pulses for 2023–24 (Kharif & Rabi), which estimate the production of lentil at 16.36 lakh tonnes (previous production 15.59 lakh tonnes), gram at 121.61 lakh tonnes, and tur at 33.39 lakh tonnes (previous production 33.12 lakh tonnes).



Chickpeas/ Chana: Back to Content

 Chana markets showed downward trend in most markets, due to decreased demand, weak arrivals and lower output influence the market.

- Chana arrivals decreased in Karnataka & Maharashtra due to reduced sowing & lower yields, coupled with adverse weather in MP, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh, could affect crop quality and yield, leading to harvesting delays.
- Govt. procurement at MSP of Rs 5,440 per quintal set to commence soon, but farmers may hold back sales due to higher local mandi prices.
- India imported 91,010 MT of white chickpeas from April to Dec 2023, as compared with 815 MT during same period previous year. Although exports from April to Dec 2023 were 74,287 MT, down by 13% from 85,516 MT during same period last year.
- According to recent data from DoAFW, Chana sowing as on 02nd Feb is 10,474 thousand hectares, down by 5.4% from 11,071 thousand hectare during same time previous year.
- The Indian government approved the purchase of 139 thousand tonnes of Chana at MSP in the Karnataka state under PSS scheme.
- Madhya Pradesh government will start farmers registration for Chana/Gram procurement from 20th February till 10th March 2024
- This year, White Chickpea production is anticipated to increase as farmers expand the area under White Chickpea in major growing regions of Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, and Maharashtra. Farmers increased the area as prices were more than Rs. 100 per kgs during the previous year. (Link)
- As per final USDA production estimates for 2023, Chickpea production estimated at 214,200 MT, increase by 28% from 167,193 MT during last year.
- As per ABARES report published on 05th Dec, Australia Chickpea production estimated for year 2023-24 is 528 thousand tonne, down by 2.4% from 541 thousand tonne in previous year.
- According to Statistics Canada's report released on 05th Dec Chickpea production forecasted to be around 142.1 thousand tonne, increased by 10.9% from 128.0 thousand tonne in last year.


Daily Price chart:

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Masur/ Lentils:

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- According to final rabi sowing data, Masur sowing is up by 5.6% as on 02nd Feb to 1957 thousand hectares from 1852 thousand hectare during the same time in previous year.
- Masur dal portal to guarantee MSP to farmers: The government is set to launch a portal for masur dal (lentil) where farmers who register will be guaranteed the minimum support price (MSP) for their produce. (link)
- After rice and atta, govt to offer Bharat masur dal, but at market prices: After Bharat atta and rice, the Union government is planning to launch Bharat masur (lentil) dal but, at around ₹89 per kg, without a discount. (link)
- Canada is going to have tight stocks of the crop and so will Australia, which recently shipped out a record 250,000 tonnes of red lentils in December. Red lentils are selling for about US\$700 per tonne cost and freight (CNF) in India, which is the price-setter for the crop.(link)
- Prices decreased due to arrival of new lentils and sales by importers: There is a declining trend in the prices of lentils
 due to increase in arrivals and weak demand. The arrival of new lentils has started in the producer markets of Madhya
 Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh.
- As per sources, lentil stock at port is 1,15,500 MT, of which 67,300 MT are at the Mundra port and 48,200 MT are at the Hazira port.
- According to the data, India's Lentils import in Dec 2023 is 2,37,835 MT, increased by 159% from 91,738 MT at same time last year. While exports in Dec 2023 is 7,483 MT, increased by 13% as compared with 6,593 MT during Nov 2023.
- According to STATCAN, Canada's Lentil stock till 31st Dec 2023 was at 1 MMT, which is the lowest level in the last three years and down by 28% from 1.4 MMT during last year.
- As per report, 6,325 MT of lentils were imported at Chennai port between 16 to 31 January. Out of which 5,375 MT lentils from Canada, 275 MT are from Russia, and 675 MT lentils are from USA.
- According to Statistics Canada's report, Lentil area for year 2024-25 is expected to rise by 8% to 1.6 million ha. from
 1.4 million ha. during 2023-24.
- According to Statistics Canada's report released on 05th Dec, Lentil production is estimated at 1.67 MMT, up from the September forecast of 1.54 MMT but still down by 27% from 2.30 MMT during previous year.
- According to ABARES report released on 05th Dec, Lentil production estimated at 1.39 MMT down by 17.4% from 1.68 MMT in previous year.



Pigeon Pea/ Tur:

- Tur prices show a mixed trend in most markets. In the upcoming week, Tur prices are forecasted to stay within
 a narrow range due to limited mills' purchases, subdued demand for Tur dal, liquidity constraints, slow Govt.
 procurement in Gujarat and select southern markets, and concerns over govt. intervention in case of price hikes.
- The government held a review meeting with stakeholders on the rising prices of pulses. The government cautioned traders to not get involved in hoardings and efforts are on to import at lower prices. According to sources, the government may impose a price cap on Tur imports to curb the rising prices. (Link)
- According to the data, India's Tur import in Dec 2023 is 82,103 MT, decreased by 59% from 2,01,837 MT at same time last year. Total import in financial year from Apr-Dec 2023 is 6,27,565 MT, decreased by 1% from 6,34,763 MT during same period previous year.
- According to sources 8,300 MT of pulses were imported at Chennai port between 8th -14th Feb. Out of Which 3,150 MT Burma Urad, 4,450 MT Burma Tur and 625 MT Lentil was imported.
- Tamil Nadu civil supplies corporation invites tender for purchase of 60,000 MT of Tur dal (Split-Husked and Fatka –
 Domestic and Imported) and Lentil locally known as Canadian Yellow lentil (Split-Husked and Laired No. 2 or Whole
 Husked).
- Farmers have not responded very well to the government's tur dal procurement at market rate because of the lower
 price, stricter quality standards, and formalities involved. Small farmers sell their produce to traders, whereas larger
 farmers hold their harvest in anticipation of future price increases. (Link)
- Indian government procure Tur and Masur to maintain pulses buffer to stabilize prices. It has been decided to meet the 80% demand for a buffer through this special scheme. The procurement will be done at District wise minimum assured procurement price (MAPP) or Dynamic Buffer Procurement Price (DBPP).
- Indian government launched an e-portal on 4th Jan to procure pulses above market rates. The pulses will be procured by government backed cooperatives like NAFED and NCCF.


Arrival in current marketing year is up by 8.2% due to arrivals increased in major Tur markets in states like Maharashtra, Karnataka and Gujarat.

Black Mapte/ Urad:

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- Urad prices show a mixed trend in most markets due to increased selling in Burma and availability of forward Burma Urad at cheaper rates.
- According to the data, India's Urad import in Dec 2023 is 56,068 MT, decreased by 42.3% from 97,997 MT at same time last year. Total imports in the financial year from Apr-Dec 2023 is 4,57,434 MT, increased by 19% from 3,83,506 MT during same period previous year.
- According to sources, India imported 3,000 tonnes of Urad from Brazil and is probably going to purchase more 20,000 tonnes this year. India is diversifying its import sources of pulses as domestic output declines. (Link)
- Reports state that 29,275 MT of pulses were imported at Chennai port between 1st -7th Feb. Out of Which 9,225 MT Burma Tur, 16,200 MT Burma Urad and 3,675 MT Lentil was imported.
- Summer Urad sowing acreage as on 23rd Feb is up by 2.7% at 37 thousand hectares from 36 thousand hectares at same time last year.
- As per 1st Advance estimates of Kharif pulses, Urad production is estimated at 1.5 MMT as compared to 1.7 MMT during the previous year.

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Moong / Green gram:

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- Moong markets showed downward trend in most markets due to an decrease in demand. However, Moong price in Gulbarga increased and traded at INR 95,000 per tonne.
- As per report, NAFED moong stock is approximately 0.45 MMT. Most stock in Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan.
- Summer Moong sowing acreage as on 23rd Feb is up by 12.3% at 91 thousand hectares from 81 thousand hectares at same time last year.
- To intervene and control the price of pulses, government-led organizations provide subsidized moong dal. Approximately 5 lakh tonnes of Moong stock are now held by NAFED. NAFED is offering Moong dal at INR 107 per kg. Whereas currently average retail price of Moong dal is INR 116/ Kg.
- As per 1st Advance estimates of Kharif pulses, moong production is estimated at 1.4 MMT as compared to 1.7 MMT during previous year.





Rainfall Forecast: Next Four Week




